Sexual Health Is . . .

- Consensual
- Non-Exploitive
- Honest
- Based on Shared Values
- Mutually Pleasurable
- Protective Against HIV, STIs and
- (Unintended) Pregnancy

Healthcare Rights in California

- Insurance coverage on Parent's Policy Up to Age 26.
- Confidential Medical Release (CMR)
- Mental Health Counseling Services
- Drug and Alcohol Counseling and Rehabilitation Services
- Sensitive, Confidential Prevention and Treatment Medical Services

HIV and STIs (Sexually Transmitted Infections)

- Having an STI increases your chances for HIV infection and transmission
- STIs are much more common than you think
- Half of the population will get one STI at some time in life
- Most STIs have no signs or symptoms

STIs

- Bacterial STIs are "curable but repeatable"
- Viral STIs are "treatable but incurable"
- Sex partners must be treated even if they have no symptoms

What is HIV? Human Immunodeficiency Virus


- Virus
- Infects humans
- Weakens the immune system
- Destroys healthy cells used to fight disease & infection
- Treatable not curable
- If untreated HIV replicates quickly



What is AIDS?

Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome

- Advanced stage of HIV infection
- Severely damages immune system
- Difficult to fight infections & certain cancers



 Requires medical intervention to prevent death


How is HIV spread?

 An HIV+ person transmits the virus to an uninfected person through these bodily fluids:

Blood

Semen

- Pre-seminal fluid
- Vaginal fluid
- Breast milk



How HIV is NOT spread?

- Sweat or tears
- Urine
- Saliva
- Casual contact
- Toilet Seats
- Air or water





Insect bites, including mosquitos

HIV Prevention

- Not having sex (abstinence)
- No injection drug use . . .
 the <u>only</u> 100% sure methods of protection
- Use condoms correctly and consistently
- Talk to your partner and agree to protect yourselves

HIV Prevention

- Know Your HIV Status!
- Know your partners status!
- Ask and verify!



- Reach out to a trusted adult (AB329)
- Think smart if considering tattoos



Who can be infected?

Anyone ...

who engages in unprotected sex or shares injecting drug "works" (needles, syringes, etc.) can be infected with HIV, regardless of age, sex, gender, race, or sexual orientation.


HIV Symptoms

- Flu-like symptoms:
 - high fever
 - sore throat
 - swollen lymph glands
 - fatigue
 - May not show symptoms
- Symptoms may appear
 10 days 3 months after unprotected or "risky" sexual behavior





HIV VIRUS



Key to Terms

HIV capsid: HIV's bullet-shaped core that contains HIV RNA


HIV envelope: Outer surface of HIV

HIV enzymes: Proteins that carry out steps in the HIV life cycle

HIV glycoproteins: Protein "spikes" embedded in the HIV envelope

HIV RNA: HIV's genetic material

HIV VIRUS REPLICATION



Global Statistics



- 75 million infected with HIV disease
- 35 million people are living with HIV/AIDS
- More than 36 million have died of AIDS worldwide since the first cases were reported in 1981
- 2.3 million still become newly HIV-infected each year

U.S. & Local Statistics



- 50,000 new HIV cases each year, nationally
- 6,698 individuals living with HIV in Orange County, as of December 31, 2014
- 261 new infections each year in Orange County
- 1,340 estimated individuals unaware of their HIV status

HIV Infections in O.C. Youth

- 25% of new HIV infections among youth, ages 13 - 24 years
- Young males get HIV from male to male sex
- Heterosexual contact
- Injection drug use

An HIV Test

- Can be anonymous
- Is free at many sites
- Results within 20 minutes



- Two kinds of tests: blood and oral swab
- Getting tested is the only way to know if you are infected

Know your status – get tested

- 1 in 5 infected people are undiagnosed
- 60% of youth living with HIV do not know that they are infected
- Know your status get tested
- Stop the Spread End the Epidemic(ETE)


Curable?

HIV treatment has social, emotional and physical ramifications.


Social Issues/Mental Health

- Fear
- Discrimination
- Isolation
- Disclosure
- Stigma



Stigma Leads to...

- Social isolation
- Fear of disclosure
- Fear of getting tested
- Medical non-adherence
- Increased HIV symptoms & transmission
